Shingrix - Shingles Vaccination

From 1 September 2023, you're eligible for the shingles vaccine when you turn 65. You'll be offered 2 doses of the Shingrix vaccine. These are given between 6 and 12 months apart. The surgery will contact you to make an appointment to have your shingles vaccine. If you turn 65 before 1st September 2023 you will have to wait until you turn 70 to become eligible for the shingles vaccine. If you are immunocompromised, from 1st September 2023, and are aged 50 or over you will be able to get the shingles vaccine and there is no upper age limit to you coming forwards to get the vaccine.

New Phones

In early March 2024, we will be moving to a new Cloud Based Telephony system. This new phone system will have some handy features for patients, such as call back, so you don't lose your place in the queue. The phone numbers will remain the same.
